### What is Advanced English?

Advanced English is aimed at the top 30% of students in English. It is for students who are stronger writers and readers, who may be looking to use the skills and knowledge for university study. Students study a range of more difficult and challenging literary texts, across film, prose, poetry, non-fiction, and Shakespearian Drama.

Advanced English is required for students who wish to study Extension 1 English (Preliminary and/or HSC) or Extension 2 English (HSC only).
