#### Welcome Back to Term 3

Welcome back to Semester 2 2017, the final term for our HSC candidates. We hope the break was a chance for families to spend valuable time together and all students are refreshed and ready to tackle the challenges that lay ahead.

#### School Development Day

Teachers began the term with a school development day on Monday July 17 featuring guest speaker, Dr Andrew Fuller. Andrew Fuller, a clinical psychologist, has with many schools worked and



communities around Australia, specialising in the wellbeing of young people and their families. He is a Fellow of the Department of Psychiatry and the Department of Learning and Educational Development at the University of Melbourne.

Andrew has recently been described as an "interesting mixture of Billy Connolly, Tim Winton and Frasier Crane" and as someone who "puts the heart back into psychology", and he did just that!

Andrew used lots of humour and research to expose staff to many variables. Topics included:

- Motivating learners by getting their brains into states, which help them to learn.
- Increasing sensory inputs to make learning richer, stronger and more interesting.
- Ways of optimising the level of attention in learners
- Designing learning in ways which make sense to different learners

Staff feedback on the day was extremely positive. Our next challenge is to determine .... Where to from here? - How we

can use this information to consolidate what we do as teachers in our classrooms.

#### **External Validation**

All NSW government schools will undergo a new accountability process known as "External Validation" in the next few years. Georges River College Oatley Senior Campus will participate in validation on the 26th October, 2017.

The process is primarily based on self – assessment, using categories (Excelling, Sustaining and Growing or Delivering) against a framework of three domains:

- Teaching
- Learning
- Leadership.

We have selected SIX focus areas on which our self - assessment is based:

- Visible Learning
- ALARM
- Collaboration
- Positive Behaviour for Learning
- Transition
- Student Well-being

These have been selected as it is believed they represent the heart of our school, where our energies and directions have been focused and where our achievements can be seen.

For each of these focus areas, numerous pieces of evidence have been provided to substantiate the school's self -assessment beliefs.

On the 26th October, two principals will come to the school for two hours to "validate" our assessment, having considered documents and evidence prior to their arrival. I look forward to the opportunity of showcasing our school, providing a rich array of programs and practices for our visitors to see and hear.

#### Year 12 Trial HSC Exams

The HSC trial examination period will conclude this week. Year 12 classes will be running as normal from Wednesday 23rd August until the end of term. A number of courses still have topic work to complete and attendance is essential. In addition to this, all classes will be undertaking a revision program to help consolidate the learning that has taken place over the last 12 months.

It is imperative that students attend all classes to maximise their performance in the fast approaching HSC examinations. We will continue to support our students in their pursuit of achieving their personal best.

Education Week is a state-wide, annual event to celebrate public education in NSW. This year it was held from 31 July to 4 August and the theme is I Learn, We Learn. It is a celebration of the Department of Education's commitment to ensuring:

Ideally they will have several options in mind and will apply for multiple courses or jobs



- TAFE: TAFE may have a stall at the UTS Open day on Sat 26th August. Enrolment will open early December. Ring the campus offering the course for details. Students are advised to make an appointment with a TAFE Careers Adviser.
- University: Students received the new UAC Guide 2017-18 at our annual University Market on 2nd August. They were also able to speak with University representatives (current or newly graduated students) who gave handy tips and shared their knowledge and advice. Students need to apply to UAC by 29th September to avoid a late fee, but can then continue to adjust preferences.

# **Anger and Aggression**

Anger and Aggression in young people often masks deeper emotions



To assist with anger and aggression in young people we need to normalise anger as an emotion. We need to extend adolescence vocabulary on their own emotions. It is important that we help young people understand their triggers. Don't assume that young people understand the concept of 'Flight or flight' means.

#### What can we do?

- We want to encourage creative choices and positive risks
- We can teach young people to count to 8. In 8 seconds there is a huge change in the body's physiology. The heart rate slows, breathing slows down.
- Adults need to model positive behaviour management
